#### **TBA Relief Fund**

With the closure of arts venues and cancellation of shows, and with shelter-in-place orders due to COVID-19, workers in the performing arts have lost untold amounts of expected income. Many are losing secondary income (teaching jobs, restaurant/ bar jobs, gig work) as well. Most of these artists were already living very close to the margin in our high-costof-living area, and have no emergency funds to fall back on. Theatre Bay Area launched the COVID-19: Performing Arts Worker Relief Fund, a resource for performing arts workers who are facing a loss of income due to the ongoing COVID-19 crisis.






