He is the recipient of the Leigh Weimers Emerging Arist Award, the Emerging Artist Laureate by Arts Council Silicon Valley and Theatre Bay Area Director's TITAN Award. Selected directing credits include The Language Archive and The Santaland Diaries at TheatreWorks Silicon Valley, Vietgone at Capital Stage, A Doll's House, Part 2 and Eurydice at Palo Alto Players, Peter and the Starcatcher and Noises Off at Hillbarn Theatre, The Grapes of Wrath, The Crucible and Yellow Face at Los Altos Stage Company and Uncle Vanya at the Pear Theatre. As a playwright, his plays have been produced and workshopped at The BindleStiff Studio, City Lights Theatre Company and Custom Made Theatre Company. His play Writing Fragments Home was a finalist for the Bay Area Playwright's Conference and a semi-finalist for the O'Neill Playwright's Conference. In addition to his work in theatre he works as an educator and advocate for issues of Equity, Diversity and Inclusion and has served as a grant panelist for the Zellerbach Family Foundation, Silicon Valley Creates and Theatre Bay Area. He is the Casting Director at the Tony Award Winning TheatreWorks Silicon Valley, a graduate of the Multicultural Arts Leadership Institute and a proud alumnus of the UC Irvine Drama Department.

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What is Our Digital Stories?

In short? A completely free evening of three short digital stories set within the digital world, this fundraising production will give viewers the option to donate to local theatre organizations. Tonight, we feel lucky to be supporting Silicon Valley De-Bug.

Silicon Valley De-Bug is a community organizing & storytelling organization started in San Jose, CA 20 years ago. With families whose loved ones were facing charges or incarcerated De-Bug developed the Participatory Defense Model for people facing charges, their families and communities to impact the outcomes of cases and transform the landscape of power in the court system. The model is practiced in 30 cities across the country.

De-Bug has active campaigns on immigration, against police violence, housing and more. They have also walked with families who lost loved ones to police violence on their journey to support each other, demand justice, change policy and now defund the police.

The idea for Our Digital Stories came from a group of artists eager to find a way to contribute to the community and to find a creative outlet while sheltering in place. What came of it was a fundraiser event surrounding a series of pieces that were set within the digital world - video chats, phone calls, texts - and performed on the digital medium of the story. We saw these as a hybrid of a ten minute play and a short film and called them "Digital Stories."



Ohlone College Playwrights Festival, and Utopia Theatre






